	☐ Update: Marcus Foundation grant approved \$4.5M (for 4 years); the desire is to be able to track youth services and civic engagement; we received \$400,000 more than what they've given us in years prior			
	This is an outcome after not maintaining the relationship very well years prior; thankful to Torrey & Joe for their cultivation to get the chance to show them what amazing things we are doing in our schools and through KIPP Forward			
	☐ Update: application prep for Woodruff Foundation (Capital)/Whitehead (Operating)

	☐ Goizetta Foundation — the committee is curious if the ask is too low (they typically give 3-year grants (operating) \$225,000-\$375,000 *interest in entrepreneurial efforts)

	Exposure to careers and jobs scholars can experience through different industries.
	Substantial exposure opportunities (like with Delta Aviation Program)
	Mentorship partnerships for our scholars to learn, 1-on-1, from individuals in these industries
