Our Commitment

At KIPP STRIVE Campus (KSC), we are committed to continuously creating opportunities to connect with our families. We recognize that family involvement is essential to the success of our scholars, and we deeply value the contributions each family member makes toward our shared goal of student achievement.

This plan outlines how KIPP STRIVE Campus will support parent and family engagement throughout the school year. It also highlights key ways families can participate, plan, and promote growth through our campus events and activities.

KSC is dedicated to engaging all of our families, from kindergarten through eighth grade. We will provide meaningful opportunities for participation for all families, regardless of race, gender, language, or ability.

HOW IS OUR PLAN DEVELOPED?

At KIPP STRIVE Campus (KSC), we believe family voices are essential in shaping our work. Parents are encouraged to share feedback on this plan at any time throughout the year, including during all KIPP Family Network (KFN) meetings.

During our first Phoenix Table Talk of the year, families shared what matters most in family engagement. These Table Talks occur monthly and provide parents with direct opportunities to speak with school leaders and influence our collective decisions.

All feedback gathered throughout the year is used to strengthen this plan and guide revisions for the following school year. Copies of the plan are available in the Main Office and on our family communication app, ParentSquare.

WHAT IS TITLE I?

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), signed into law by President Obama on December 10, 2015, is our nation's commitment to equal opportunity for all students. It reauthorized the long-standing Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), first passed over 50 years ago.

Title I, Part A is a federally funded program under ESSA. Its purpose is to ensure that all children have a fair and equal chance to receive a high-quality education and to meet state academic standards. Title I funding provides additional support and resources to help schools close achievement gaps and raise student success.

A key part of Title I is the partnership between schools and families. The law emphasizes the importance of family involvement, especially in:

- Keeping families informed about their child's progress
- Ensuring access to high-quality teaching and learning
- Aligning curriculum and instruction with challenging state standards
- Building strong communication and collaboration between parents and schools

So what does all of this mean? As a Title I campus, KIPP STRIVE receives additional resources to support scholar achievement and strengthen our partnership with families. Examples of resources discussed with families include staffing support, student meals, uniforms, classroom technology, and family engagement resources.

As a Title I campus, KIPP STRIVE families receive the following important family documents:

- The KIPP STRIVE Parent & Family Engagement Plan
- The School-Parent Compact
- The Parents Right to Know notification

Families may also request information about their scholar's teacher qualifications by contacting the appropriate front office or the Campus Family Liaison.

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KIPP STRIVE Campus Academic Achievement Goals

At KIPP STRIVE Campus, we know that scholar success is a shared responsibility between our school, our families, and our community. Our goals for the year reflect our commitment to high expectations, equity, and excellence for all students.

SY26-27 Campus Goals:

- **Georgia Milestones:** 85% of scholars in grades 3–8 will score Developing or better on all Georgia Milestones assessments, with at least 38% scoring Proficient or better.
- **iReady Growth:** 70% of scholars will meet or exceed their growth target on iReady.
- **DIBELS Progress:** 80% of scholars in grades K–2 will demonstrate average or above-average growth on grade-level DIBELS assessments.
- **Attendance:** At least 82% of scholars in grades K–5 and 90% of scholars in grades 6–8 will attend school for 90% of scheduled days.

Every Scholar, Every Day starts with our families. Families support this goal by making sure their scholar is **in school on time every day**, communicating with the school when an absence is necessary, and partnering with our attendance support team when needed.



KIPP STRIVE Campus will take the following measures to promote and strengthen school–family connections, recognizing parents and family members as essential partners in our community:

Communicate Consistently

- **ParentSquare** – Our primary digital communication platform for campus announcements, reminders, family events, weekly newsletters, surveys and important updates.
- **Weekly Newsletter/Love Notes** – Provides upcoming dates, campus updates, family engagement opportunities, attendance information and important reminders. The full newsletter is distributed digitally through ParentSquare.
- **Wednesday Folder** – Used for select printed materials and scholar/family information.
- **Parent Centers** – Paper copies of select family communications and resources are available for families who need printed materials.
- **Teacher Communication** – Families do not have to wait until a conference to speak with a teacher. Families may contact their scholar's teacher to request an individual conversation or meeting regarding academic or classroom concerns.

Provide Academic Support

- Offer tutoring for struggling scholars through multiple avenues, including master teachers, extended learning, and community partners.
- Share resources and strategies with families during academic nights, report card conferences, and workshops.

Empower Staff & Families Together

- Offer staff trainings on effective family communication and engagement strategies.
- Include family representatives on committees with leaders and community stakeholders to enhance school operations and decision-making.

Support Scholar Transitions & Growth

- Plan transitional events from Primary to Academy, such as Principal Forums, Family Nights, and Preview Days.
- Celebrate scholar progress through community-building events like enrichment showcases and Friday Celebrations.



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School-Parent Compact

The School-Parent Compact (SPC) is a written agreement between the school community and parents. This written agreement indicates how all stakeholders of our school community agree to share in the effort to raise scholar academic achievement. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, scholars, and teachers.

Parent's Right To Know

This annual Title I notice informs families of their right to request information about the professional qualifications of their scholar's teachers and instructional staff. Families may contact the Campus Family Liaison or school front office for assistance.



A Place for All to Be Involved

Throughout the year, families will have multiple opportunities to connect, learn, and lead alongside us.

Know How Your Scholar Is Doing:

Family engagement starts with knowing how your scholar is doing academically, behaviorally and socially. Families have multiple ways to stay informed throughout the year.

Academics- Use Infinite Campus to see updates on graded assignments. Review progress reports and report cards, participate in conferences and academic nights, and communicate directly with your scholar's teacher.

Behavior- Use LiveSchool to review behavior points and updates entered by staff. Each scholar has an individual access code. If you need your scholar's LiveSchool access information, contact the school front office for assistance.
